

- Make sure all of the required pages are included and in the correct order.
- Include pictures, newspaper articles and judge's sheets.
- Highlight your name in any included articles.
- Do not include ribbons, pins, whole programs or Bugles, or any 4-H project materials.

## Sign the Wisconsin Covenant Pledge!

All Wisconsin students who were in 8<sup>th</sup> grade this past school year and will be in 9<sup>th</sup> grade this fall 2011 are encouraged to sign the Wisconsin Covenant Pledge, no later than September 30, 2011. By signing the pledge, they are agreeing to work hard and fulfill certain requirements:

- Graduate from a Wisconsin High School
- Maintain at least a B average while in high school
- Take classes that will prepare them for high school and make them eligible for admission to a Wisconsin institution of higher education.
- Demonstrate positive citizenship by completing community service or service learning hours and abiding by the law
- Apply for federal financial aid by April 1 of their senior year of high school
- Apply to a Wisconsin institution of higher education

If they fulfill these requirements and submit the necessary paperwork to the State Covenant office by April 1 of their senior year of high school, they will be confirmed as Wisconsin Covenant Scholars who are guaranteed admission to a Wisconsin institution of higher education and entitled to a Covenant Grant worth \$250-\$1000, based on family's average income. If a student's family's average income is \$25,000 or less students are also entitled to a Covenant Foundation Grant of \$1500. The grants are available to students for up to four years (8 semesters).

The goal of this program is not only to encourage students for their hard work, positive citizenship, and follow through but to help make certain they earn their college degrees by removing the lack of money as a barrier to their education.

The deadline to sign the Wisconsin Covenant pledge is <u>September 30, 2011</u>. Between now and the deadline, 8<sup>th</sup> graders are encouraged to sign the pledge to benefit from the program. ## ATTENTION JUNIOR DAIRY **EXHIBITORS** -THE CALL FOR CRAYONS IS ON!

West Allis, WI – May 2, 2011 – The call for crayons to junior dairy exhibitors is back! 2011 marks the fifth year that junior dairy exhibitors are being asked to bring crayons with them to the annual Wisconsin State Fair. In recent years, approximately 4,000 boxes of crayons have been collected by junior dairy exhibitors, along with some Fair related businesses, to benefit Milwaukee area schools. The crayons were used for the early age and after school programs.

The 2011 challenge is similar to the challenge in years past - collect at least one case of Crayola crayons (24-count boxes) from each county in Wisconsin; however, 4-H clubs and FFA chapters may choose to contribute individually. Additionally, individuals, local businesses and organizations are encouraged to contribute crayons.

There are over 100 elementary schools in the Milwaukee Public School system with thousands of students in the elementary grade levels. This is an outstanding opportunity for clubs to do a community service project with 100% of the donation going directly to the people it's intended to help.

The idea initially came to Joel Franke after speaking with a teacher who worked in the Tommy Thompson Youth Center at the 2007 Wisconsin State Fair who shared she had purchased crayons for her students, because all students are not fortunate enough to have the resources to secure all the supplies they need. Franke is the overnight supervisor of the Junior Dairy Barns at the Fair.

Crayon donations may be dropped off at the front desk of the Tommy G. Thompson Youth Center during the Fair or at the Crawford County display in the large dairy barn. The presentation to Milwaukee School officials will be at 2 pm on Saturday, August 6 at the Dairyland Youth Celebration in the Coliseum.
